
2 days in the Hawaiian Islands

Tues., Jan 24 Honolulu

The Arizona memorial at Pearl Harbor - the memorial building rests on the sunken wreckage of the battleship Arizona - the Arizona was sunk during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on Dec 7, 1941 - the attacked plunged the US into World War II - about 1100 crew members are entombed in the wreckage below - it is a very moving experience to visit the site



Here is a pix of several officers getting impatient - they were waiting for a tour to return - they were late - the ship waited and left almost 3/4s on an hour late - because it was a tour booked on the ship, they waited - if an independent tour was late, they probably would not have waited - why I have decided I will only book tours on the ship (3)



Wed., Jan 25 Lighthouse at the harbor on Kauai Island, Hawaii - on our way to Tahiti - 2500 miles - 5 sea days - the captain said we have calm seas for the trip - also said we are heading south and can expect warm weather - should be a good trip



Jan 28: 3rd day at sea after touring the Hawaiian Islands

When we crossed the equator, there was a big party at the main pool - someone was thrown in the pool to commentate the event - note the giant screen where they show movies, football games and whatever - it is bright enough to be able to see it in daylight - French Polynesia tomorrow 1/31/23- no more sea days longer than three in a row until mid-March - the captain just made an announcement that a helicopter will be landing on the ship this afternoon - for health reasons a

passenger will be airlifted off the ship.



Jan 31: Tahiti, French Polynesia

The beach in Tahiti where "Mutiny on The Bounty" was filmed - note the grey sand - in the movie, the sand was white - Hollywood thought the sand should be white so they trucked in white sand from another island - the sand in Tahiti is grey because the island is new (in geological terms) - the island is a French colony - French and the native language is spoken - English widely spoken - there are many captivating scenic vistas - everywhere you look, the native vegetation is thick and lush - an idyllic place!







Feb. 1: Moorea, French Polynesia

Mt Rotui, Moorea, French Polynesia - the island of Moorea is about 12 miles

northwest of Tahiti - geologically, it is about a million years older than Tahiti - only about 17,000 people live on the island -



Looking across to Tahiti from Moorea coral reefs everywhere - the hotel has rooms that are over the water - about \$900 per night

Sat. Feb. 4, 2023 American Samoa

The Polynesians inhabited the islands back to about 1800 BC. the Europeans did not come until 1722. The islands have been an American territory since 1900. The harbor was a very important US Naval base in World War 2. Total population of the islands is only 11,500. Note the dense foliage on the hills.

Thursday, Feb. 9 New Zealand

A Kiwi farm - the crop ripens in a couple of months and will be shipped all over the world - the sweetest (and most expensive) go to China and Japan, because they like them sweet and are willing to pay the price - the least sweet (and least expensive) go to Germany because they don't like them sweet - we are leaving early because of a possible storm.



** Friday, Feb. 10 **UPDATE**

Travel is an adventure - with adventure there are changes - we are going to have a major change - you may have heard of the news of a hurricane in the Pacific (actually they are called cyclones in the Pacific) - we have made a change in course to avoid a cyclone - we had 3 more stops scheduled in NZ - they are all cancelled - instead we will turn and head for Melbourne, Australia and will arrive there Wed, 2/15 - we had not been scheduled to go to Melbourne - we are now expected to be in Sydney as scheduled Sat, 2/18

Sat., Feb. 11 Relatively quiet night at sea last night - apparently, we are going to travel between the North and South Islands of NZ and then head straight to Melbourne - I have not heard any complaints from passengers about the cancellations - I guess all are happy to be away from the storm!

Note: We safely by-passed the Hurricane and are currently in Australia. However, here are a few more pictures from New Zealand.

Auckland, New Zealand - includes the tower the city is famous for - the tower is claimed to be the tallest structure in the southern hemisphere



An anchor from the *Bounty* - when the mutineers took over the *Bounty*, their ship became caught on a coral reef - they used this anchor (the auxiliary anchor) to pry the ship off the reef - then they cut the line to the anchor and sailed away - the anchor was discovered on the reef by accident in 1932 - it is on display in an excellent marine museum In Auckland
