A message from our newly-elected Grand Master:

DIRECTIVE NO. 1

May 29, 2020

To: All Particular Lodges and Members of The Grand Lodge of Florida

The Governor of Florida has lifted the stay at home orders and other restrictions that were set forth due to the coronavirus pandemic. As Grand Master, I hereby ORDER AND DIRECT that effective on June 1, 2020, all Lodges may open and continue with Lodge activities.

All Lodges will be able to resume normal Lodge Meetings and events such as, but not limited to, all Masonic Education/Masonic Leadership Training Classes, Secretaries and Treasurers Seminars, Child ID Events, Social Gatherings, all Allied and Appendant Orders and Masonic Youth Groups that meet in any Lodge buildings, and Lodge building rentals.

We encourage all Lodges to follow the health and safety guidelines as set forth by the Center for Disease Control. All Lodges must have a hand sanitizing station at the front door of the Lodge Building for Brothers to use upon entering. If Brothers wish to wear gloves and masks they may do so but this is not a mandatory requirement and the Brothers must provide their own personal protective equipment.

Please continue to practice "social distancing" and following the guidelines that have been set by the Center for Diseases Control. Use common sense and your best judgement. If you are sick, have a fever, or just don't feel good please do not come to Lodge.

It shall be the call of the Worshipful Master to go dark for the summer months and a vote of the Lodge is not needed; however, proper notification must be made to the membership and also to the Grand Secretary.

Take due notice and govern yourselves accordingly.

Recommended & Required Practices to Employ when Returning to Lodge Operations

- <u>SICK? STAY HOME.</u>: *If you are sick in any way*, have a fever, and especially if you have any symptoms of sickness related to COVID-19, *stay home and do not attend functions*.
- AGE & CONDITIONS: Members classified as "senior citizens" aged 65 or older and members with significant underlying medical conditions (such as chronic lung disease, moderate to severe asthma, serious heart conditions, immunocompromised status, cancer, diabetes, severe obesity, renal failure and liver disease) are strongly encouraged within the Florida Governor's Executive Order 20-112 to stay at home and take all measures to limit the risk of exposure to COVID-19. If attending events, extreme caution should be employed. Such individuals are known to have the most likeliness of potential severe illness or death from the illness.
- **SOCIAL DISTANCING**: No individuals should stand, sit, meet, or congregate in groups without appropriate recommended <u>6 foot spacing & distancing</u>.
- **TESTING**: It is recommended to be <u>tested for COVID-19</u> at any of the local, free test sites. See <u>www.hillsboroughcounty.org</u>, click the "STAYSAFE" link at the top for COVID-19 info, then click the button for "Getting tested for COVID-19" to find free testing sites. If you are found to be positive, remain home in quarantine for 14 days or as directed by health officials.
- **BE EDUCATED**: Know the <u>basics on what to do, and not do</u>, concerning interactions. Resources are available at https://floridahealthcovid19.gov.
- **HAND WASHING**: <u>PROPER 20 second hand washing</u> as described on posters is required as frequently as possible (before entering the dining room & Lodge Room, during breaks).
- **HAND SANITIZER**: It is recommended to obtain (if possible) and <u>carry a small bottle of hand sanitizer</u> in your pocket to use frequently.
- **HAND SHAKING**: Hand shaking as a greeting should be <u>discontinued</u> at all times.
- <u>MASKS</u>: It is recommended to <u>wear a mask upon entering the building and traveling within it</u>. Once you are seated at appropriate distances in the dining room or Lodge Room, masks can be removed.

The Sons of Liberty

The Sons of Liberty was an organization formed in the years before the American Revolution.

In 1765 the British government who were unhappy supporting the 10,000 troops that they had stationed in the American colonies, decided to levy a tax on the colonies. This was called the Stamp Act of 1765. In the act anything that was printed in the colonies, whether it was a legal document, playing cards or anything in between, was required by law to be printed on paper that was created in London and had an embossed revenue stamp on it. This caused a series of legislative actions in various colonies in opposition to the stamp act, starting in Virginia. The motto for this resistance became "No taxation without Representation." This caused groups to form in all of the colonies who violently opposed the Stamp Act and other taxes that had been levied.

In August of 1765, the Sons of Liberty formed in Boston, Massachusetts. Soon a committee was formed in New York to communicate with other colonies and to coordinate efforts in opposing the taxes. Some of the violence that was incited led to the tar and feathering of tax collectors. This was meant to injure and humiliate the tax collectors.

On December 16th, 1773 the Sons of Liberty in Boston held their most famous act of rebellion against the tax acts. The Boston Tea Party had the members of the Sons of Liberty climbing on board British merchant ships and dumping taxed tea into Boston harbor. This action led directly to the American Revolution.

The Sons of Liberty in Boston was largely made of Freemasons from the area. Although it was not a Masonic organization and did not have an exclusive masonic membership, many of the leaders of the organization were Freemasons. A masonic legend holds that the night of Boston Tea Party, St. Andrew's Lodge of Boston, which owned the Green Dragon tavern meeting place of both the Lodge and the Sons of Liberty, had their regular meeting that night. In the minutes of the meeting it allegedly stated that the meeting was canceled due to lack of quorum. Presumably that all the members were off dumping tea in Boston Harbor.
