

Recommended & Required Practices to Employ when Returning to Lodge Operations

- MASKS: As of the time this Trestleboard was published, Hillsborough County requires us to ensure compliance by denying admittance to any indoor location to people who aren't wearing a face mask, or removing people from our Lodge who aren't following the mandate. Once you are seated at appropriate distances in the dining room or Lodge Room, masks can be removed.
- <u>SICK? STAY HOME.</u>: *If you are sick in any way*, have a fever, and especially if you have any symptoms of sickness related to COVID-19, *stay home and do not attend functions*.
- AGE & CONDITIONS: Members classified as "senior citizens" aged 65 or older and members with significant underlying medical conditions (such as chronic lung disease, moderate to severe asthma, serious heart conditions, immunocompromised status, cancer, diabetes, severe obesity, renal failure and liver disease) are strongly encouraged within the Florida Governor's Executive Order 20-112 to stay at home and take all measures to limit the risk of exposure to COVID-19. If attending events, extreme caution should be employed. Such individuals are known to have the most likeliness of potential severe illness or death from the illness.
- **SOCIAL DISTANCING**: No individuals should stand, sit, meet, or congregate in groups without appropriate recommended <u>6 foot spacing & distancing</u>.
- **TESTING**: It is recommended to be <u>tested for COVID-19</u> at any of the local, free test sites. See <u>www.hillsboroughcounty.org</u>, click the "STAYSAFE" link at the top for COVID-19 info, then click the button for "Getting tested for COVID-19" to find free testing sites. If you are found to be positive, remain home in quarantine for 14 days or as directed by health officials.
- **<u>BE EDUCATED</u>**: Know the <u>basics on what to do, and not do</u>, concerning interactions. Resources are available at https://floridahealthcovid19.gov.
- **HAND WASHING**: <u>PROPER 20 second hand washing</u> as described on posters is required as frequently as possible (before entering the dining room & Lodge Room, during breaks).
- **HAND SANITIZER**: It is recommended to obtain (if possible) and <u>carry a small bottle of hand sanitizer</u> in your pocket to use frequently.
- **HAND SHAKING**: Hand shaking as a greeting should be <u>discontinued</u> at all times.

Masonic Education – Tracing Boards


The Tracing Board is used in masonic education and lectures.

A Tracing Board is used in masonic degree work to illustrate ideas and principals put forth in its Degrees. The origins of the Tracing Board go back to the Masonic Lodges in the 18th century and before.

In the beginning of Freemasonry, in England and around the World, Freemasons did not meet in a lodge hall. Instead, they rented out the back room of a tavern once a month, or however often they held their meetings. Appropriate diagrams and other items indicating the Lodge were drawn, often with chalk, on the floor of the tavern to indicate the information that they needed to convey in their Degree work.

Some historical references have the Tyler, probably as part of the ritual of the time, drawing a rectangle on the floor. Possibly to represent the security of the room as would be the Tyler's responsibility. As the Degree progressed, the Worshipful Master or other Officers of the Lodge would fill the rectangle in with appropriate images. Most of which we would probably not recognize as being part of modern Freemasonry, particularly as you go back into the 18th century and before.


After the Degree was complete, the candidate would be directed to remove the chalk drawings with a mop and bucket. This would be a reminder of his oath of secrecy.



Sometime in the 19th century as symbols were adopted by the Fraternity more permanent mechanisms were used. These ranged from painted boards that could be displayed or carpets that could be laid down for candidates to see. Despite the fact that these had come into vogue in the Fraternity at the time, most Grand Lodges discouraged their use since they were now a permanent display and could not be erased with a simple swipe of a mop.

By the 20th century the idea of the Tracing Board began to die out. Logically this probably coincided with more and more Lodges moving from the back room of a tavern and into their own buildings. The idea that the Lodge had to be 100% portable, sometimes referred to as a "lodge in a box", had gone away and it was now easier to have more permanent displays or larger items that could be used to illustrate the ideas and principles of Freemasonry.

Several examples of Tracing Boards still exist and can still be used to relate the concepts of Freemasonry to a candidate.









