

This month question: What is the significance of The Cable Tow (Masonic find.com)

A cable-tow is usually attached to a Mason's robe. In the ancient days, cable was a strong rope used to tie together with heavy objects on a raft. A tow was also a rope used for pulling objects. A cable-tow, therefore, was a robust heavy rope used for binding and pulling objects. In Freemasonry, the cable-tow is a visible symbol of a person's pledge to the craft. It

represents a vow that a Mason will fulfill his duties and help a fellow brother to his full capability. The length of the cable tow indicates the extent to which a member is willing to go in assisting a fellow Mason.

That is why the length of a cable tow is significant in Freemason. The cable-tow can be related to the cord that unites a mother and child during birth. After a child is delivered, the physical bond between them is cut and replaced with unconditional love. During initiation, the cable-tow is removed from the candidate because the vow taken on the altar is stronger than a visible tie. It becomes a moral constraint bounding a person to Brotherly love in the craft. The bond becomes a two-way traffic where a person is linked to Freemason, and Freemason is bound to the person.

The following is a continuing look at masonic related definitions – some are basic but most are informative. Hope you enjoy!

ECLIPTIC: the imaginary line followed on the earth's surface by the direct ray of the sun during the year. It makes an angle of 23' 27' with the equator. Jerusalem is located in approximately 31' 30' north attitude, that is, approximately 7' 3' north of the ecliptic.

EAR, THE ATTENTIVE OR LISTENING: The Hebrew word means not only to hear, but to understand and to obey.

EAST: From the Sun worshipers down through the ages, the East has always been considered the most honored place because the Sun rises in the East and is the region from which light rises.

EAVESDROPPER: One who attempts to listen surreptitiously; literally, one standing under the eaves and thus gets only the "droppings."

EMBLEM: A representation of an idea by a visible object; a symbolical figure or design.

EMBLEMATICAL: symbolical, representing.

EMBROIDERED: having a border.

ENTERED APPRENTICE: In Operative Masonry the apprenticeship lasted seven years; if then found acceptable, the apprentice's name was entered on the books of the lodge and he was given a recognized place in the craft organization.

EUCLID: the first mathematician to Systematize the science of geometry.

EXAMINATION: the examination of a brother to determine his geniuses should not aim at displaying the committee's knowledge. It is a test of the visitor. He need not be able to answer questions from the Posting Lecture. He should know the signs, grips, and words.

EXPULSION: Forcible ejection from membership for such reasons as un-Masonic conduct, crimes, etc. It is the most severe of Masonic penalties and deprives the person of all rights and privileges formerly enjoyed from his lodge and the Fraternity as a whole.

York Rite Lessons

This week's York Rite Lesson comes to us from our Grand King, R.E. Companion John Gray. This is an excerpt from his paper on the Four Veils.

Why four veils when there were 12 tribes of Israel and how did they come about?

According to the Holy Bible in the book of Numbers, Chapter 2, explains the origination of the four veils which was by God's command to Moses and Aaron that Camps will be set within the tribes located in the East by the tribe of Judah, South by the tribe of Reuben, West by the tribe Ephraim, and North by the tribe of Dan, the other Tribes fell under their command of the chosen Captain for each camp and armies were formed for the defense and protection of the children of Israel and the Tabernacle. Exodus chapter 26 verse 31 through 37 describes the Color of the veils and how they were presented. At the second building of the Temple there is no mention of the Veils by name, so it was by God's command, that the names were adopted form the pass passage of biblical history.


