








The FC Degree & The Winding Staircase: a 3-Part Series

My Brothers: With the initiation of 4 Entered Apprentices due to be competed in July and August (next EA Deg. 8/19)... in the Fall, we will be "passing" these Brothers to the degree of Fellow Craft. So, I've revisited some of the core concepts of this degree.

The Fellow Craft degree is truly transformative for the developing Brother, focusing on intellectual and moral development. It emphasizes the importance of education, knowledge, and the pursuit of wisdom. It also encourages Brothers to explore the liberal arts and sciences, and to deepen their understanding of the world around them. This sacred, and often "under-appreciated," Degree, is all about personal growth, intellectual curiosity, and continuing the journey towards enlightenment.

The Winding Staircase in Freemasonry is a symbolic element that represents the journey of self-improvement and spiritual ascent. Each step symbolizes a virtue or a lesson to be learned, and the staircase itself signifies progress and the continuous path of personal growth. It's a pretty neat symbol!

— The numbers three, five, and seven are significant in Freemasonry because they symbolize various important concepts. The number three often represents the three principal stages of life or the three key virtues. The number five can represent the five senses or the five orders of architecture. The number seven is often linked to the seven liberal arts and sciences, as well as the seven steps to wisdom. Together, they emphasize a journey of enlightenment and deeper understanding.

Part 1

The Core virtues of Freemasonry

In Freemasonry, **Beauty**, **Wisdom**, and **Strength** are core virtues often symbolized in both ritual and architecture. Here are some of the key symbols associated with each

1. Wisdom

Wisdom is the ability to apply knowledge and good judgment. In Masonic symbolism, it is often associated with leadership and thoughtful planning.

Symbols of Wisdom:

- The Worshipful Master's Station in the East Symbolizes the rising sun and enlightenment.
- The Pillar of Wisdom (Solomon) King Solomon, who is renowned for his wisdom, represents this virtue.
- The All-Seeing Eye Often interpreted as divine wisdom and awareness.
- The Letter "G" Can represent both Geometry and God, tying wisdom to divine and mathematical order.

2. Strength

Strength is the capacity to uphold principles, maintain faith, and support the structure (literal and metaphorical). **Symbols of Strength:**

- The Senior Warden's Station in the West Where the sun sets, symbolizing completion and stability.
- The Pillar of Strength (Hiram of Tyre) He provided the materials and labor to build the Temple, symbolizing steadfast support.
- The Doric Column Represents robust and plain strength in classical architecture.
- The Square A tool that represents moral rectitude and strong character.

3. Beauty

Beauty reflects harmony, proportion, and the aesthetic ideal—both in physical construction and character. **Symbols of Beauty:**

- The Junior Warden's Station in the South Noon, the height of light and activity.
- The Pillar of Beauty (Hiram Abiff) The architect of the Temple, representing artistic skill and design.
- The Corinthian Column The most ornate order of architecture, symbolizing beauty and elegance.
- The Compasses Represent balance, grace, and moral boundaries.
