

The FC Degree & The Winding Staircase: a 3-Part Series

Part 3 of 3: The Winding Staircase & The "Seven" Steps

My Brothers, we are pushing forward in our work to deliver a stellar and memorable degree ceremony; "Passing" Brothers Bagnuik and Curtain to the degree of Fellow Craft in the "Farmers Degree" on Nov.1st

We have described the intellectual and moral maturity of a Fellow Craft via the "Three and Five" steps allegories of the Winding Staircase, wherein the Fellow Craft degree is focused on cultivation of wisdom and ethical character, emphasizing the importance of education, knowledge, and the pursuit of truth. In this the final climb up the "Winding Staircase," we teach Brothers to undertake a deeper exploration of the liberal arts and sciences, thus further deepening their understanding of the world around them. Let's go into the symbolism and wisdom found beyond the Fellow Craft's "ascent" of the Three & Five steps on the Winding Staircase... onward to the Seven Steps!

The Seven Steps

The Seven "Steps" in Freemasonry refer to a symbolic progression of moral and spiritual growth toward the maturity of the Brother. These represent stages of self-improvement, enlightenment, and the pursuit of wisdom. They guide The Fellow Craft along a path of personal development and ethical living.

The Symbolism & Allegory of these Seven "Steps" are aligned with the Seven liberal arts and sciences, often referred to in Freemasonry, the Seven liberal arts are divided into two groups: the Trivium and the Quadrivium, which are classical models of education that date back to ancient Greece and Rome.

The Trivium (3) consists of grammar, logic, and rhetoric, which are the arts of language and communication.

The Quadrivium (4) includes arithmetic, geometry, music, and astronomy, which are the arts of number and the physical universe.

Together, these Seven "Steps" afford a pathway to the progressive ascent toward moral perfection, spiritual illumination, and the attainment of wisdom, representing a well-rounded foundation for the intellectual and moral development of the Fellow Craft Mason

This, my Brothers, concludes Part 3 and the final article describing the important, and beautifully symbolic, allegorical concepts of the "7 stairs" relating to The Winding Staircase portion of the Fellow Craft degree.

I hope that this series was both enjoyable and educational for all; I enjoyed sharing it with you.


A message from Frienship Chapter No. 209 Order of the Eastern Star


