

The Brotherhood of Freemasonry & Why it is the *"Sine qua non" of the Craft

Our Brotherhood of Freemasonry is the oldest and most revered fraternal organization in human history; it's deeply rooted in principles of moral integrity, charity, and brotherly love. At its core, Freemasonry emphasizes personal growth, ethical conduct, and community service. Most Masonic scholars agree, that the deep and intangible sense of *real brotherhood*, bonds Freemasons with an unparalleled thirst to support one another and foster a sense of unity and trust... **The Essential Element of the Craft*. This is especially true at J.F. Swartsel. As Worshipful David Lambert and I many times end our discussions with, "it's ALL about the Brotherhood!"

At 'Swartsel" we work to strengthen and improve the Brotherhood, via the rigor, ritual and shared activities of our fraternity focusing on several key aspects. First, regular communication and meetings help Brothers stay connected and engaged. Second, mentorship programs are crucial for guiding newer members and sharing knowledge. Third, community outreach and charitable activities help strengthen bonds and make a positive impact. Finally, embracing diversity and inclusivity ensures that the Brotherhood remains vibrant and welcoming. We have, in 2025, packaged all of this work with the "Bow of Joy"... *let's face it we got a ton done and had fun doing it!*

When a Lodge loses sight of the central elements of <u>above all nourishing the Brotherhood</u> including and encouraging Brothers to be a part of the organization. In my short time (5-years) as a Brother, I have observed and been informed of detrimental discord in other lodges and even our own beloved #251. Lack of harmony, respect and temperance creates damaging fragmentation of the brotherhood, where inuendo, gossip and disrespect ferment. This splitting into 'Cabals" of members of any Team, causes extreme negativity, thereby damaging the sense Brotherly Love and Joy. These self-serving divisions are sometimes created within the lodge by Brothers that ignore the quest for harmony and to best work and best agree. Different factions can have their own interpretations or priorities, and that can lead to conflicts or even significant contention among members. It can also make it harder to maintain a unified vision or mission, and that can weaken the overall Brotherhood. Moreover, it can sometimes cause a lack of trust, where members might feel less connected or less supported. Overall, it severely undermines that sense of unity and camaraderie that Freemasonry aims to build. *Let us work to AVOID and REJECT any type of these negative actions at Our Lodge!*

For a fraternity, team and above all a Masonic Lodge to operate as a content / well-run machine and to avoid dysfunction, a proven pattern of consistency is paramount. The progression of the line of officers in Freemasonry plays a pivotal role in fostering positive-energy and zeal for the lodge. It helps maintain continuity, ensures that officers gain experience over time, and it also promotes a sense of mentorship and stability within the Lodge. This progression definitely contributes to harmony and consistency, because it builds trust and ensures that everyone is on the same page in terms of ritual and governance. When there is a lack of leadership progression and continuity, it can lead to organizational issues. For example, new officers might not have the same level of experience or mentorship, which can cause inconsistencies in how rituals are performed or how the lodge is managed. It can also create confusion among members, lead to a lack of trust, and potentially cause discord within the lodge. Ultimately, it can undermine the lodge's stability and the overall member experience. Another key negative outcome is that intentional disruption of leadership progression can routinely lead to decreased member engagement, because if people feel like there's a lack of structure or consistency, they might not be as motivated to participate. At best, the disruption of the leadership progression is disabling and contentious. Logically, this can lead to injurious fragmentation, where different groups within the lodge might start to go in different directions...



Another great stated communication! A lot of fun was had by all and we received some some very informative education from W:. Greif.




Some of the fun from the meeting spilled over into the post meeting celebration. I'm sure they had a toast to W:. McPherson to celebrate his birthday.
